Dear Jonathan BERNSTEIN:

This is in response to your request for access to historical information found in agency immigration records regarding Irene Paley. You requested a copy of the subject's Alien Registration Form/AR2, A5569024, Certificate of Naturalization/C-File, C5832450, and Visa File, V2211878, for Genealogy Records Request 50278174.

We have considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing the record set and have applied the FOIA exemptions as required by the statute and the Attorney General's guidance. We have completed the review of all documents and have identified 102 pages that are responsive to your request. Enclosed are 49 pages released in their entirety and 46 pages released in part. We are withholding 7 pages in full. In our review of these pages, we have determined they contain no reasonably segregable portion(s) of non-exempt information. We have reviewed and have determined to release all information except those portions that are exempt pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6), (b)(7)(c), and (b)(7)(e) of the FOIA.

Exemption (b)(7)(E) of the FOIA provides protection for records or information for law enforcement purposes which would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law. The types of documents and/or information we have withheld could consist of law enforcement systems checks, manuals, checkpoint locations, surveillance techniques, and various other documents.

Exemption (b)(6) permits the government to withhold all information about individuals in personnel, medical and similar files where the disclosure of such information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld may consist of birth certificates, naturalization certificates, drivers' licenses, social security numbers, home addresses, dates of birth, or various other documents and/or information belonging to a third party that are considered personal.

Exemption (b)(7)(C) provides protection for personal information in law enforcement records, which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. We have withheld information relating to third-party individuals. The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld could consist of names, addresses, identification numbers, telephone numbers, fax numbers, or various other documents that are considered personal.

The enclosed record consists of the best reproducible copies available. Certain pages contain marks that appear to be blacked-out information. The black marks were made prior to our receipt of the file and are not information we have withheld under the provisions of the FOIA or PA.

The Genealogy Program cannot provide certified copies or an original copy. In agreement with the Italian Consulate and German Consulate, the applicant must present the packet provided by our office that contains a photocopy of the naturalization certificate along with the USCIS Genealogy Program response

letter that is **stapled** to the records along with the envelope they arrived in to the Consulate. In any instance, this serves as the only form of authenticating that the records were provided to you by the Genealogy Program.

As a result of discussion between agency personnel and a member of our staff, as a matter of administrative discretion, we are releasing computer codes found on system screen prints previously withheld under exemption b(2). There may be additional documents that contain discretionary releases of exempt information. If made, these releases are specifically identified in the responsive record. These discretionary releases do not waive our ability to invoke applicable FOIA exemptions for similar or related information in the future.

You have the right to file an administrative appeal within 90 days of the date of this letter. By filing an appeal, you preserve your rights under FOIA and give the agency a chance to review and reconsider your request and the agency's decision. You may file an administrative FOIA appeal to USCIS at: USCIS FOIA/PA Appeals Office, 150 Space Center Loop, Suite 500, Lee's Summit, MO 64064-2139. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."



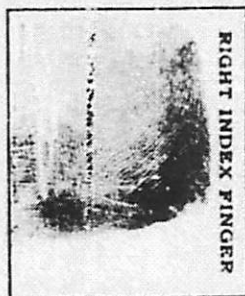

Q. You are informed that I am an officer of the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service and as such am authorized to administer oaths and to take testimony in connection with immigration and naturalization matters. I desire to take a statement from you regarding the enforcement of the Immigration laws and regulations

Any statement which you make must be voluntary on your part and may be used in any proceedings the Government may see fit to institute, whether civil or criminal. Are you willing to make such a statement freely and voluntarily under oath?

A. Yes.

Q. You are informed that if you willfully and knowingly give false testimony you may be prosecuted and if convicted, be subject to fine and/or imprisonment. Do you understand?

A. Yes.

Q. Please stand and raise your right hand. (Subject complies) Do you solemnly swear that the statements you are about to make will be the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, so help you God?

A. I do.

Q. What is your full, true and correct name?

A. Irene Paley.

Q. Have you ever been known by any other name; if so, by what other name?

A. No; before I was married my name was Irene Strauss.

Q. When and where were you born?

A. 3/10/1903 - Marburg, Germany.

Q. Of what country are you a citizen?

A. U. S. Citizen. Naturalized in Cape May on 5/13/1943.

Q. Where do you now reside?

A. 42 S. 6th Ave., Coatesville, Pa.

Report

- Q. How long have you lived at that address?
A. Between 6 and 7 years.
- Q. Where did you live before that?
A. At 24 N. Iowa St., Atlantic City, N. J., where we lived from about 1941 to about 1948.
- Q. What other addresses did you live at in Atlantic City, N. J.?
A. 9 S. California Avenue and 11 S. California Avenue and 108 N. Iowa Avenue.
- Q. When did you join the American Congress Organization?
A. I did not join. They always sent me an invitation to join but I never joined.
- Q. On December 18, 1940, at Atlantic City, N. J., when you registered under the Alien Registration Act, you swore under oath at that time that in addition to other organizations you were a member of the American Congress Organization. How do you explain that testimony?
A. I must have been at the time, but I cannot recall now, because oath or not - I would not lie. (Added:) Everytime I refer to American Congress I mean American Jewish Congress.
- Q. When did you join the American Congress Organization?
A. I haven't any idea.
- Q. Where did you pay your dues to the American Congress Organization?
A. I haven't any idea. They sent me little cards, but I never paid. I might have paid once, but I don't remember.
- Q. Where did these cards come from - Atlantic City?
A. I think so - I'm not sure.
- Q. How many meetings of the American Congress Organization did you attend?
A. As far as I remember, not one.
- Q. Did you hold any office or position with this organization?
A. I don't remember that I ever belonged to it - so how should I hold an office.
- Q. Please list the name of any organizations or societies of which you have ever been a member of at any time in your life?
A. Sisterhood of Rodef Sholem Synagogue in Atlantic City, Hadasah, ^{Misrechi} ~~Wasserman~~ and now ~~Wasserman~~ I am a member of the Sisterhood in Coatesville - Beth Israel, a member of the Parent Teachers Organization of Scott Sr. High School in Coatesville, the Parent Teachers Organization of Gordon Jr. High School. When I was about 19 I belonged to Agudas Yisrael in Germany.
- Q. When did the American Congress Organization start to send you these cards about your dues?
A. I don't know, really. When I was in Atlantic City I often got these cards, but I paid no attention to them. I don't receive them now. (Added:) I got these cards from the American Jewish Congress.
- Q. How much were the dues supposed to be?
A. I haven't any idea.

- Q. Did you just state while the stenographer was typing that previous question that this organization was devoted to anti-semitic ideas?
- A. No. As far as I know, they try to protect children against it. I don't remember that I ever was at a meeting. Maybe they asked me at the time to join. Our child in Coatesville, he suffers from anti-semitism - they call him "Jew". (He's very good in school - one teacher said he would like to have 30 kids like him.) they insult him verbally.
- Q. Is your husband a member of the American Congress Organization?
- A. No.
- Q. Did your husband receive cards from this organization?
- A. I never received cards from the American Congress Organization. I did receive them from the American Jewish Congress.
- Q. Did your husband get any due cards from the American Jewish Organization?
- A. No, I don't think so.
- Q. How do you explain the fact that you were getting cards from this Organization and your husband was not?
- A. Well, I guess they tried to get me in.
- Q. Did you ever have any discussion with your husband about this Organization trying to get you to be a member?
- A. Never.
- Q. Do you customarily withhold information of this nature from your husband?
- A. I would not swear that I did not tell him. I threw the cards ~~xx~~ out.
- Q. Do you know anyone in Atlantic City who is a member of this organization - the American Jewish Congress?
- A. I don't know now.
- Q. ~~pp~~ Did you know anyone in Atlantic City, while you were living there, who was a member of the American Jewish Congress Organization?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Please give me their names and addresses?
- A. Mrs. Batzer. Her address, I think, is - (b)(6)
- Q. Did you only know one person in Atlantic City who was a member of the American Jewish Congress?
- A. Maybe at that time, I knew somebody, but I don't recall anybody now.
